"History of Sports in Peterborough"
by Sheryl Smith

Since its inception in 2002, Peterborough has embraced the Doors Open concept. Free visits to historic or unusual locations have given thousands of visitors insights into this city's storied past.

In September 2011, theme chosen was "History of Sports in Peterborough." Sheryl Smith will take you on an illustrated trip across the city to learn more about this engaging sports history, and also reflect upon the past and future of Doors Open Peterborough.

Sheryl Smith **was b**orn and raised around the Rideau Canal National Historic Site of Canada, Sheryl attended McMaster University where she received an Honours BA in Anthropology, and later the University of Manitoba, where she obtained an MA in Anthropology / Archaeology. Her Master's thesis was about a small Middle Woodland fishing camp on Georgian Bay and was published by the Ontario Government.

After joining Parks Canada in 1981, Sheryl did national parks archaeology and then was appointed Chief of Archaeological Research for the Ontario Region, a position which she held until 1994. She was then Aboriginal Affairs Advisor for the Ontario Service Centre until very recently, retiring after almost 31 years with Parks Canada. Her duties included liaison with First Nations and Aboriginal organizations, advice to managers on relationship-building, land claims, treaty information, and so on. Her work also involved promoting the national commemoration of Aboriginal history. She was a member of several national Parks Canada working groups and still maintains links with First Nations and other government organizations.

A family move brought her to Peterborough in 1998 where Sheryl became involved with a number of organizations including St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, PACAC, Doors Open Peterborough, and other heritage-related special events such as the 2004 Ontario Museum conference, the 2009 Ontario Heritage Conference, the 2011 Peterborough Heritage Week Celebrations, and now the 2012 Canadian Association of Conservators Conference.

Sheryl is proudest, however, of her family – husband, biologist and wildlife photographer Mike Eckersley, wonderful grown daughters Meaghan, Kristen and Patricia, and two energetic Springer Spaniels. They live now in Smith-Ennismore-Lakefield Township, overlooking Lake Katchewanooka. True to her Scottish roots, Sheryl calls their location "the cheap side of the street"!

# Looking forward to February AGM meeting, and Dinner Honouring Ontario's Premiers: Dimensions of the Premiers' Gravesites Program

In 2007, at the behest of then MPP Jim Brownell, the Government of Ontario created the Premiers' Gravesites Program to honour Ontario's former premiers by marking their gravesites. The Ontario Heritage Trust was chosen to design and implement this special new program as an extension of its role in commemorating significant events, people and places in Ontario's history. Premiers' Gravesites Program Coordinator, Kathryn McLeod will speak about the dynamics of the Program and its contributions to the field of Public History in Ontario.

Kathryn is a graduate of the Master of Arts program at the Frost Centre for Canadian Studies and Indigenous Studies at Trent University. She is currently working part-time for the Ontario Heritage Trust and with Professor Thomas H.B. Symons as his research and administrative assistant. She is a member of the municipal heritage committee for Peterborough (PACAC) and acted as the Volunteer Coordinator on the Doors Open 2011 Committee.

The Peterborough Historical Society welcomes nominations for its annual Heritage Awards from now until Monday, March 5, 2012.

Nominees must reside within the boundaries of Peterborough County. They may be individuals, businesses, institutions, organizations, groups, or members of the media. Nominations will be considered for projects completed in the previous year and will be evaluated by an independent Awards Committee.

If you are aware of a deserving project or person, submit an application! Individuals may also nominate themselves or their own project.

The Heritage Awards will be presented at a special ceremony and reception for winners and their family and friends on Wednesday, April 18, 2012, at 7:30 PM at Empress Gardens, Charlotte Street, Peterborough.

The five awards, named in honour of former citizens of Peterborough who made significant contributions to the Peterborough area, are listed below:

- The F. H. Dobbin Award acknowledges exceptional coverage of historical events through articles, photos, or videos.
- The Charlotte Nichols Award is awarded in recognition of substantial financial donations towards the preservation and/or recognition of historic sites, artifacts, etc.
- The Samuel Armour Award recognizes the involvement and exposure of students to local historical opportunities, programs, and/or development of curriculum based on local history.
- The George Cox Award recognizes historical restoration and/or preservation of Peterborough properties. (artifacts, structures, gardens, parks etc.)
- The J. Hampden Burnham Award recognizes the creation of venues for public awareness of historic events, places or people.
