Canon Davidson Home

The British Wesleyan Methodist Church was on this site from 1840 to 1847. The building was later used for private schools and for teachers. It was the town's Union School from 1854 until Central School was built in 1860. In the early 1850s it was also used for church services by the congregation of Saint John's Anglican Church. In 1878 fine houses were built at 64 Hunter and 406 Sheridan Sts., each having a two-storey bay projection, a central hall plan and a large front entrance with transom and side lights. Between 1890 and 1912 Canon J.C. Davidson, who was Archdeacon of Peterborough from 1920, lived at 64 Hunter Street.
