

# Malone House

Immediately east of this point, but obscured by planting from the Trail, is Malone House. It was completed in 1852 and occupied that year by Andrew Charles and Eleanor Susannah Stewart Dunlop. He was a local carriage manufacturer, and in 1866 and 1867 was reeve of Ashburnham. Eleanor, the second daughter of Thomas A. and Frances Stewart, later edited her mother's letters describing pioneer life in Douro, which were published in 1889 as *Our Forest Home*. In nearly every aspect the house is a duplicate of Auburn II, which her parents erected in 1841-1842, with its solid walls built of cedar timbers placed vertically and held in place by sills at the top and bottom. The entire frame is covered inside and out with hand-split lath and plaster.
