



# Peterborough Historical Society Annual Heritage Awards Call for Nominations: Deadline 6 March 2023

As a means of encouraging programs and activities that commemorate our rich history and acknowledge achievements in the fields of cultural, social, and architectural history, the PHS presents the Annual Heritage Awards for Peterborough City and County citizens. The awards recognize outstanding heritage preservation and promotion accomplishments and are named in honour of Peterborough citizens who have made significant contributions to the broader heritage community. There are seven separate awards.

The Peterborough Historical Society welcomes nominations for its annual Heritage Awards until Monday, 6 March.

Except for the Symons Award, nominees must reside within the boundaries of Peterborough County. They may be individuals, businesses, institutions, organizations, groups, or media members. Except for the Symons Award, nominations typically will be considered for projects completed in the previous year. An independent Awards Committee will evaluate them. If you know of a deserving project or person, apply. Individuals may also nominate themselves or their own projects.

The Heritage Awards will be presented at a ceremony, to be announced, or individually.

The Thomas H.B. and Christine Symons Heritage Award is bestowed for outstanding one-time or ongoing contributions to local, regional, provincial, national, or international heritage causes made by residents, former residents, groups, businesses, or organizations from or to the Peterborough region.

**The Samuel Armour Award** recognizes the development and/or delivery of programs, activities or curriculumbased local history material that engages students in exploring the region's diverse history.

**The J. Hampden Burnham Award** recognizes the completion and presentation of a significant project in any media, such as a painting, video, web design, newspaper articles, etc., that promotes awareness of the region's history.

The George Cox Award recognizes the sympathetic redesign or sensitive new construction that respects the existing character of significant cultural resources, such as buildings, cultural landscapes, period gardens or the preservation of manuscripts, photographic collections, etc.

The F.H. Dobbin Award recognizes the publication of a major fiction or non-fiction work focusing on Peterborough's past.

The Martha Kidd Award honours the memory of Martha Kidd, historian of architecture and Peterborough's built heritage, and recognizes outstanding work in preserving our region's heritage.

The Charlotte Nicholls Award recognizes a substantial donation of financial, in-kind, or services to commemorate a historic structure, artifact, cultural landscape, etc.

"Nurse, we have had a very nice sleigh-drive. I like sleighing very much over the white snow. The trees look so pretty, as if they were covered with white flowers, and the ground sparkled just like mamma's diamonds.

It is pleasant, Lady Mary, to ride through the woods on a bright sunshiny day, after a fresh fall of snow. The young evergreens, hemlocks, balsams, and spruce-trees, are loaded with great masses of the new-fallen snow; while the slender saplings of the beech, birch, and basswood (the lime or linden) are bent down to the very ground, making bowers so bright and beautiful, you would be delighted to see them. Sometimes, as you would be delighted to see them. Sometimes as you drive along, great masses of the snow come showering down upon you; but it is so light and dry, that it shakes off without wetting you. It is pleasant to be wrapped up in warm blankets, or buffalo robes, at the bottom of a lumber-sleigh, and to travel through the forest by moonlight; the merry bells echoing through the silent woods, and the stars just peeping down through the frosted trees, which sparkle like diamonds in the moon beams"
