As we start 2024, winter has finally decided to show her head, with several storms blanketing the county. The museum has been closed throughout the month of January in order to complete a few maintenance projects. First up was removing the old carpet in the museum office.

Thank you to Susan and Rich Matthews, Paul Lumsden and Erin Murphy for their help with moving furniture and taking the carpet away. Caroline Priddle helped museum staff remove the old UV filter on the windows of the Sandford Fleming and Keeping Room. Once the windows were cleaned, new filters were put in place. These filters are important for protecting the artefacts from the harmful effects of light. Catherine Martin helped staff with an inventory of the Bookshop. This is done annually for both our annual report and the year-end financials. Our last large project of the month was a complete cleanout of our back storeroom. This involved having to move everything out and sort out which items were no longer needed, consolidate containers and reorganize shelves. A new wall was built to create a small changing area for the costumes, and the costumes were sorted and photographed to update the costume database. Ones in need of repair were set aside. Thank you to Caroline, Catherine, Linda Chandler, Paul Lumsden and Don Willcock for all of their help with this project.

After a successful Hogmanay, the museum decided to create Robbie Burns Day take-home meals for pick up on Robbie Burns Day, January 25, 2024. This year, the museum sold 40 meals.
